Bobbie Heckathorn Cookie Sale Award – made a significant contribution to the Council Cookie Sale (requires two endorsements)

Camping Award – been instrumental in the development and utilization of camping facilities (requires two endorsements)

Courage and Adversity Award – shown courage by overcoming adversity and given back to the community in an inspiring manner (requires two endorsements)

Family Involvement Award – from the same family who have actively contributed to the growth and enrichment of the Girl Scout Movement (requires two endorsements)

Glenella Scarborough Outstanding Volunteer Facilitator Award – Outstanding service as a Learning Facilitator (requires two endorsements)

Going Green Award – instrumental in “Environmental Awareness” education in order to reduce waste and make the world a better place (requires two endorsements)

Marian Hardy Service to Volunteers Award – high-caliber service in the areas of recruitment, and/or development, and/or retention of adult volunteers (requires two endorsements)
